# Awaiting fire engineer approval for contractor proposal

We last wrote to you to let you know about further assessments to your buildings which would disrupt parking in June. Following those inspections, the original contractor of your building has written up their findings and we've now received a proposal from them to remediate the issues within the external wall system.

As a reminder, our original investigations identified some issues with the installation of cavity barriers – these are designed to restrict the spread of smoke and flames in the external wall system.

#### **Next steps**

Over the coming weeks, our fire engineer will be reviewing the proposal to remediate your buildings. If they approve the proposal, we will be able to start the project to sort the issues in the external wall system. If we get to that stage, we'll write again to let you know our expectations for the project start date and subsequently will invite you to a resident webinar to go over all the details.

# A summary of this letter

Following further checks made in June, the original contractor of your building has produced a proposal to fix issues with the installation of cavity barriers.

Cavity barriers are barriers in the external wall designed to slow the spread of smoke and fire.

Our fire engineer is reviewing the proposal and will let us know if it is approved over the coming weeks.

### <u>A reminder</u>

Your building's fire strategy is simultaneous evacuation, which means you must evacuate if you hear the fire alarm, even if you think it is a false alarm.
