New subcontractor to be appointer and fire engineers to confirm work required

We've again been liaising with the original contractor of your building regarding the remedial work that needs to take place. We last told you that they were in dispute with their original subcontractor which had put a considerable delay on us being able to reach an agreement

The original contractor is now looking to appoint a new subcontractor to carry out the work and is going through that process now. This is a good step and hopefully, once a new subcontractor has been appointed, our fire engineer will be able to meet with theirs to agree how the remedial work will be carried out. Our fire engineer will be meeting the contractor and their fire engineer on-site at the end of May – we hope that this will lead to a clear route forward. As soon as we have any more information about the above, we'll share it with you.
