Dear residents,

Update on freeholder and remediation

We wrote earlier in the year to let you know that we were struggling to receive information from the freeholder of your building regarding the building safety work being carried out. We have still received very little in the way of updates from them regarding the proposals for external wall remediation for anything other than the adjoining Pinnacle Tower.

The current situation as we know it

I've summarised below the information we currently have and what we've been doing to progress this:

- Works continue on Pinnacle Tower and we have been told that all ACM cladding that was identified on the Pinnacle Tower has now been removed.
- The freeholder has received planning permission for replacement cladding materials on Pinnacle Tower, Novotel rear elevation, Tabriz rear elevation and Shams elevations.
- The freeholder has not identified to Network Homes when works will be undertaken on Shams and Tabriz. We are still in dispute with them and are keeping the government and Brent Council updated from our side.
- We've not seen a programme of works so do not know the duration.

As per our historic correspondence, Network Homes has sought legal advice which has concluded the responsibility for the external walls at Tabriz and Shams sits with the freeholder HEB Assets. We are progressing legal action to try and expedite remediation.
